Mayor Nametko called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M.

PUBLIC PORTION OF MEETING

 Rudy Miller – 6A Allen St. –Mr. Miller expressed his concern that the SID survey will not be distributed before the next budget year. He feels that the businesses should be able to voice their opinion on whether or not the SID should continue. He added that there would be backlash should the businesses not be heard. John DeLuca – 18 Kings Rd. – Mr. DeLuca read from a letter (attached to a previous email sent to the Council) requesting that the Mayor and Council allow him to clean up the DiRenzo Park Gazebo for his Eagle Scout Award Project.
 The Council suggested Mr. DeLuca meet with DPW Superintendent Robert Olivo to discuss changes. Mr. Blakeslee will set up the meeting between Mr. DeLuca and the superintendent.

• Charles Cedro – 6 Allen St. – Mr. Cedro was extremely frustrated with the ongoing flooding situation. He recounted the situation that occurred yesterday, which was attended by the Mayor and Councilman Hathaway. The Council and Mr. Cedro discussed the situation at length. The Mayor empathized with Mr. Cedro. He opened this portion of the meeting to the Council for comment. Councilman Hathaway provided additional observations that added more clarity to what was going on. He related actions Netcong has taken in support of Mr. Cedro's complaints. All were in agreement that the short-term solution put in place was not working.

A Motion was made to have the Borough Engineer to do an as built survey not to exceed \$1,200.00. The Borough Attorney will write a very strongly worded letter to the State to have this situation corrected. This motion was moved by Councilman Still and seconded by Councilman Hathaway.

The Netcong Fire Department for the month of June had a total of nine general There were eight drills and seven meetings. A total of forty-six firefighters volunteered for a total of 408.5 hours for the month of June.

The Netcong Police Department for the month of June wrote eighty-three motor vehicle summonses, ten local ordinance summonses and answered a total of 363 calls for the month. It was a big month for traffic detail and medical assists.

There was no report from the ambulance squad.

Mr. Hathaway requested an update from Mr. Blakeslee on the goose population at the lake. Mr. Blakeslee reported it has been decided Netcong will be spraying for the goose control this year. In order to dispatch the geese, a federal permit is required which can take from 6-8 months to obtain. Mr. Blakeslee will be meeting with a representative from the USDA next week to discuss dispatching of the geese. Mr. Sylvester asked if we can partner with Stanhope for this.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

The Mayor wished to address our current fence ordinance. The Council and Mr. Blakeslee discussed the various types and sizing of fencing and the potential issues with some of them. The Mayor requested that the ordinance be amended to provide a better definition of what a fence is. The Borough Attorney will get sample ordinances for reference.
