MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF NETCONG HELD FEBRUARY 20, 2014 AT THE NETCONG MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 23 MAPLE AVENUE, NETCONG, NEW JERSEY COMMENCING AT 7:30 P.M.

Mayor Nametko called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

OPEN PUBLIC MEETING ACT STATEMENT

The Borough Clerk read the following statement:

ROLL CALL

Those present at this evenings meeting included Councilwoman Butler, Councilman Hathaway, Councilman Koster, Councilman Laureys, Councilman Still, Councilman Sylvester and Mayor Nametco. Also attending: Mr. Blakeslee, Borough Administrator, Mr. Oostdyk, Mr. Bucco (arrived later) and Mrs. Eckert, Borough Clerk.

PUBLIC PORTION OF MEETING

Mr. Charles Cedro – 6 Allen St. – Mr. Cedro returned to get an update regarding the progress in resolving the drainage issues. Mr. Blakeslee noted that during an inspection this week it was confirmed that one of the pipes was obstructed. Mr. Olivo commented on the chamber. Mr. Blakeslee said that the DOT is trying to get prices for contracting the work that will stay within budget. Mr. Oostdyk read a letter from the DOT that was received by Mr. Bucco. It was noted by Mr. Olivo that they appear to be cleaning a pipe that is going to be abandoned. Councilman Hathaway agreed that there was probably a disconnect somewhere between the DOT and New Jersey transit. Mr. Cedro felt that a lot of time has passed with no results. He said we need to get one of these groups to help the town now.

BOROUGH ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

Mr. Blakeslee requested that the Council consider amending the current regulations for pennants and flags along the highway. He also wanted to review all of the electric signs that blink in the same area.

Mr. Blakeslee also highlighted an addition to his report which included updates on a gas company and online training for employees.

Councilman Hathaway strongly recommended that anyone with an issue with the signs should contact the NCP. The Council continued discussion on the various types of signs that were in use and the effect they had.

The Council also discussed the distribution of the forms and related announcements on line and in print.

Public Safety:

(Police, Fire, Rescue)

Councilman Sylvester reported that for the month of January, the Ambulance Corps had 67 total calls, 11 of which were out of town. They treated a total of 36 patients and made 36 trips to the hospital. The miles traveled were 1,082 miles and the hours volunteered were 204 hours and 8 minutes. There were 3 assists provided by the Netcong and Stanhope Fire Departments.

The Netcong fire Department had 13 general alarms. There were 5 meetings and 7 drills. There were 471.9 man-hours.

There were 2013 hours for the year. There were a total of 105 calls. 43 of those calls were mutual aid. There were 72 drills and 50 meetings. There were also 27 special details.

The Borough Police answered a total of 338 calls. They wrote a total of 107 motor vehicle summonses. There were also 31 local ordinances summonses. One of the sergeants had his knee operated on and he is currently out as a workman's comp case. He will be recuperating over the next 4 to 6 weeks.

Water Department: Shut the water service at 34 Hillside Ave. as requested by Borough Hall---Experienced service line freezing at 26 Ledgewood Ave. and 23 Rt.

206 South, both were thawed and are back in service---

Road Department: Unclogged blocked storm drains on Dell Ave. and Koclas Dr.---

Buildings & Grounds: Removed all Christmas decorations from the decorative lights on Main St., Maple Ave., Ledgewood Ave., and from Borough Hall and the Christmas tree at the firehouse---

Snow and Ice Control: Called in the Borough's plowing contractor for assistance on January 2, and January 21 2014 for a total of 86 truck hours and a total cost of

OLD BUSINESS

1. Title Search for Terrace Street Retaining Wall- Heritage Abstract Co.

Mr. Oostdyk, sitting in for Mr. Bucco the borough attorney provided a brief update. He noted that the title search was inconclusive. So far information is pointing to the fact that the wall is primarily in the right-of-way. More research is needed including review of the records and Mount Olive where this property originated. Mr. Blakeslee will contact Mt. Olive to try to obtain this information.

2. New Jersey Natural Gas Street Opening Update

Mr. Blakeslee reports NJNG has agreed to all conditions suggested by the Borough Engineer, Robert Guerin. The Mayor stated that the gas line can be completed as long as it is installed before College Rd. is paved this summer.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Discussion - 2014 Budget

The budget is still in progress and there is no new information to discuss at this time.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR TO THE COUNCIL

Council woman Butler wanted to openly discuss what was going on with the new fire truck. This would purely be discussion and have nothing to do with making a decision or voting. She was interested in the other Council member's opinions. Councilwoman Butler began by stating she did not think we were financially able to buy the truck. Plus she firmly believes that the decision had to be made on

what was going on with the two fire companies before anything else could be done. The Mayor noted that there are no capital purchases in the budget that he knows of. Councilman Hathaway felt that the leaders and the fire company are looking to the Council for direction. And he felt that the Chiefs of the fire departments should be leading the discussion. The rest of the Council joined in the conversation regarding the Netcong fire Department, the budget/budget process and related issues. For the record, Mr. Bucco joined the meeting and provided his thoughts regarding protocol for this situation.

After lengthy discussion, it was determined that the Mayor and Council are the decision makers regarding the purchase of the Quint fire truck.

Councilman Koster, Sylvester and Still are fireman and were recused from the vote.

A motion to not purchase the Quint Fire Truck was made by Councilwoman Butler and seconded by Councilman Hathaway.

Abstain: Councilmen Koster, Sylvester and Still

The Council took a brief recess at 9:18 PM and returned at 9:25 PM.

Councilman Hathaway wished to thank the Department of Public works for an excellent job with the major snow removal.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

The Mayor made a request for Mr. Blakeslee to report on the water infrastructure trust fund. Mr. Blakeslee noted that the letter of intent has been accepted and filed. He is currently working on the loan papers. Mr. Blakeslee added it would be a very low interest loan.
