MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF NETCONG HELD JANUARY 1, 2015 AT THE NETCONG MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 23 MAPLE AVENUE, NETCONG, NEW JERSEY COMMENCING AT 3:00 P.M.

Mayor Nametko called the meeting to order at 3:00 P.M.

MAYOR COMMENTS

The following was read to the audience by the Mayor after he introduced and acknowledged the valued attendees at this reorganization meeting.

Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen. On behalf of the Borough Council and all of our Borough employees, I would like to wish you Happy New Year.

When I look back on 2014 it seems we spent more time in meetings with New Jersey Department of Transportation and the Department of Environmental Protection, trying to solve our storm water problems caused mainly by the Circle Removal project. Finally after many heated hours of meetings and help from Senator Anthony Bucco and Assemblyman Anthony Bucco, I believe the State has finally agreed to do a number of short term and long term fixes to eliminate what I like to call the Duns River Falls of Netcong falling near the railroad tracks. Hopefully, this will in turn eliminate the flooding of our downtown and several of our residential areas.

We did have some notable successes dealing with the Dept of Transportation in 2014. We completed the 2nd phase of our College Rd project thanks to over \$320,000 in DOT grants for the two phases of the project. We were able to resurface the road and replace the sidewalks on College Road, from Allen St, all the way to Rt 183. We are confident the new sidewalks have increased the walking ability and safety of our students who walk to school.

Netcong was also the recipient of a \$45,000 Transit Area Enhancement grant from DOT. We will use this funding to install an additional crosswalk on Main St and way- finding signs in and around the Borough.

In February, we made a successful pitch to the Community Development Block Grant committee and were awarded \$80,000 toward the much needed replacement of the water main on Church St. This grant combined with a NJ DOT grant for \$145,000 for the resurfacing of Church St, will allow us to complete the project with a substantial savings to our tax payers. We expect to kick off the Church St. project in 2015.

After years of dormancy, we saw a remarkable increased interest in our area in need of redevelopment in 2014. Our Economic Development committee has been very busy all year meeting with developers, encouraging them to invest in our Borough. The results of these meetings, with the support of our Borough Council will provide the needed growth for the long term sustainment of Netcong Borough.

I am glad to say, the first project we worked on, the redevelopment of the Pocket Book property, has already been approved by our Planning Board. This project will deliver 72 high end apartments to a portion of our Transit Area.

We were also approached by a number of developers that were very interested in our Transit Village and the Quirk Moving Company property. We are currently working with a developer who we believe is a good fit for the first phase of our Transit Area Redevelopment. I believe 2015 will be an exciting time for us as we move forward with this redevelopment.

FINANCIALLY

Financially, the Borough is strong and with the help from our Department Heads and the work of our Finance Committee, we expect our budget will be in line with our 2% mandate from the State.

As you know, water is critical to every community. With that in mind, we are moving forward with a substantial water infrastructure project in 2015. Along with several other necessary updates, we will be rehabilitating our 1 million gallon water reservoir. We estimate the water upgrades will be approximately \$2 million dollars. To fund the projects we will submit our final proposal to the NJ Environment Infrastructure Trust Fund. If our proposal is successful, we would receive a much better interest rate than if we bonded for the project ourselves, allowing us to address all of our upgrades at one time

PERSONNEL

Employee wise, 2014 saw some turn over in our staff. One of our new police officers decided to leave us, but the position was filled by a lifelong Netcong resident SJ Reilly. I am glad to say, SJ has completed his probationary period and is now a fulltime Netcong Patrolman.

After over 30 years of service to residents, DPW Supervisor Bob Olivo decided to retire from his position to move on to the next chapter of his life. We congratulate Bobby on his retirement and thank him for his many years of dedication to the Borough. Knowing Bobby, I am sure he will not slow down much.

Bobby's position was filed by another long time DPW employee, Mike Canfield. After working with Bobby for so many years, Mike was able to hit the ground running. Mike has some great ideas for his department and has already implemented several changes. We look forward to working with him.

Unfortunately, we did lose a number of people who have served the Borough. We were saddened by the passing of Ex-Fire Chief Bruce Carlson Jr. Bruce was an active member of the Fire Department and was a past Netcong DPW worker.

Also in 2014, we lost Retired Netcong Chief of Police Lou Barbato.

Throughout 2014, we all lost loved ones. At this time, please join me in a moment of silence in their remembrance. THANK-YOU

I am sure you have heard me say many times:

Without the hard work of our office staff, our Fire Department, our Police Department and our First Aid Squad, there would be no Netcong. I would personally like to thank every one of you. Together with the volunteers on our Recreation Commission, Lake Board, Planning Board, Board of Health, Netcong Alliance and our Netcong Community Partnership, you make Netcong a great place to live and work.

I would like to thank the Council for all their work and dedication to our residents. I have spent countless hours with each of you in committee meetings. Along with the assistance of our Borough Administrator, Ralph Blakeslee and our Borough Clerk, Cindy Eckert, you make running a town look easy.

I would like to also acknowledge our Borough Attorney, Anthony Bucco who does his best to keep us in line and somehow manages to keep us out of trouble.

It was a good 2014. We look forward to a great 2015.
