MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF NETCONG HELD MARCH 12, 2015 AT THE NETCONG MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 23 MAPLE AVENUE, NETCONG, NEW JERSEY COMMENCING AT 7:30 P.M.

Mayor Nametko called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Those in attendance were Councilwoman Butler, Councilman Hathaway, Councilman Koster, Councilman Laureys, Councilman Still, Councilman Sylvester and Mayor Nametko. Also present were Mr. Blakeslee, Borough Administrator and Mrs. Eckert, Borough Clerk.

Auditor Valerie Dolan - To Address Council

Mrs. Dolan provided the details of the 2015 Budget and 2014 audit. Items noted were several fully funded capital ordinances that may merit cancellation, the purchase order approval process and the decline in dog licenses (animal control funding.) Mr. Blakeslee provided additional information regarding what research the staff had completed regarding the licensing. He also discussed alternative approval processes.

Councilman Still thanked Mrs. Dolan and all others involved with the budget for a good job.

PUBLIC PORTION OF MEETING

The Mayor opened the meeting to the public for comment.

• Charles Cedro – 6 Allen St. – He thanked Mike Canfield, DPW Superintendent and Ralph Blakeslee, Borough Administrator for their quick response opening the drain by his house during the last storm.

Mr. Cedro also requested an update on the drainage issues. The Mayor, Councilman Hathaway and Mr. Bucco provided Mr. Cedro with a brief update. Councilman Hathaway and Mr. Bucco had a discussion regarding ice and the drainage system. Councilman Hathaway discussed plans for the meeting that was taking place on March 31st. Mayor Nametko requested that Cindy Randazzo from DEP also attend this meeting.

- Ray Sylvester 129 Ledgewood Ave. Mr. Sylvester requested an update on the Pilot truck stop situation. He explained the heavy truck traffic continues to pass his house on a daily basis. Mayor Nametko explained that the Borough has had multiple meetings with Roxbury officials and have been unable to come to a resolution on this matter. Discussion continued regarding the history of this problem.
- Kerry Santalucia 11 Dell Ave. She was interested in some suggestions from the Mayor and Council to resolve the financial issues affecting the Netcong Elementary School. The Mayor and Council explained to her that the school is a separate entity and there is not much the Borough Council can do. There was a lengthy discussion by the Council Members regarding the school.

During this discussion, Councilman Laureys offered to monitor future meetings in order to properly prepare for the following year's budget. The motion was made by Councilwoman Butler and 2nd by Councilman Hathaway to approve this function.

BOROUGH ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

Mr. Blakeslee wished to highlight:

- 1. USDA planning on egg addling in April and goose culling in June. The only areas that will be completed are those within the Borough's control.
- 2. Bob Guerin, Borough Engineer's plans for Church St. has been given to the Public Works Committee.
- 3. The State will be paving Routes 206 and 183 from Chester to Stanhope. Replacing curbing will begin next week. Project should be done by October 2015.
- 4. Prospect St. Pot holes were discussed as well as other issues related to potholes in the Netcong area. There was some brief discussion regarding the snow ordinance.

Economic Development: R. Hathaway E. Still

Councilman Hathaway briefly addressed the following:

- A new antique business on Main Street.
- Transit has gone through the first step of the process of excising their property so it can be available to a developer. There will be a meeting to discuss the language in their RFP.
- Crown Point will be attending the April meeting. The LOI will be completed by then.
- The pocketbook factory was briefly mentioned
- There will be a meeting on the 31st which was mentioned earlier this evening.
- NCP Report as follows:

On February 26th the Netcong Community Partnership held its Annual Meeting and reorganized the leadership team with the following officers: Stephen Fredericks as President; Maria Patamia as Vice President; Kathy Robbins as Treasurer; and Leigh Ann Von Hagen as Secretary. Frank Koval, Dr. Ginter, and Vic Pocorobba fill out the remaining Trustee positions along with Mayor Nametko and Councilman Hathaway's continued representation of the Borough of Netcong. The attached budget was approved by the NCP as well and is before you now for final approval. Our original Annual Meeting date in January was delayed due to weather.

On Friday, March 13th the newly formed Executive Committee will be holding its first meeting at which point we will addressing the following issues:

- Retention of a new accounting firm.
- Retention of the administrative/bookkeeper position.
- Clarification regarding the responsibilities to the position of Executive Director.
- Re-organization of our committee structure to engage more members of the business and local community.
- Status report on the ongoing IRS negotiations.

Further clarification on the budget will be provided to the Council when the positions listed are filled, but will not exceed the budgetary limits set by the NCP.

With the change in focus that transpired last year that essentially derailed the efforts of our organization and through our recent restructuring we remain confident that we can serve the constituencies that we see the Netcong Community Partnership directly impacting. They are – the businesses; the local government; and the citizens of Netcong that will directly benefit from an active, thriving business district. Those three sectors are how we identify our community.

We are committed to better communication with all three of those sectors throughout this year and engaging them all in helping us to move our mission as well as the Borough of Netcong forward. We have requested the Mayor's consideration in having an NCP trustee appointment to the Economic Development Committee as well as having the Borough Administrator's active participation at our monthly Executive Committee meetings to support that initiative. We will also be providing written or inperson reports to the Town Council as we proceed.

Finally, the NCP would like to thank the Mayor, Councilmen Still and Hathaway for their support in the potential the NCP continues to hold and Mr. Bucco, Borough Attorney for his aid in dealing with the past IRS issues that this current board is committed to resolving.

Public Safety: J. Sylvester E. Koster (Police, Fire, Rescue)

Councilman Sylvester noted that the Police Department has three gun locks available.

There was a safety committee meeting with the squad. They are trying to streamline the communications system.

For the month of February, the Ambulance Corps had 52 total calls; 10 of the calls were out of town. They treated a total of 27 patients and made 27 trips to the hospital. The miles traveled were 731 miles and the hours volunteered were 173 hours and 54 minutes.

The Borough Police answered a total of 292 calls. They wrote a total of 102 motor vehicle summonses.

The Netcong Fire Department for February, 2015 had a total of 9 calls, 7 Drills, 7 Meetings, 1 Special Detail and 2 Fire Fighters in Academy. There were a total of 45 Fire Fighters performing a total of 316.9 hours.
