Economic Development: R. Hathaway E. Still

Councilman Hathaway noted that the highlights for economic development were noted in the administrator's report. He did want to mention that Crown Point has acquired the option of a Letter of Intent for the Quirk property and they are on our list to be named developer of record for that project.

Transit Village: On Monday, August 31st Mayor Nametko, Councilman Hathaway, and Redevelopment Attorney Robert Goldsmith met with representatives of NJ Transit at their offices in Newark. The purpose of the

meeting was to discuss NJ Transit's conditions for 'excessing' the property and moving forward with the developer RFP process.

Pocketbook Factory Redevelopment: Final review of the demolition permit documentation is underway.

Public Safety (Police, Fire, Rescue)

Councilman Sylvester provided the following reports:

The Ambulance Corp had 68 calls, 37 trips for 37 patients. They travelled 943 miles and volunteered 196 hours and 23 minutes. There was 1 assist.

The Police department handled 355 calls and 78 motor vehicle summonses. The hours worked looks a bit light due to vacations taken. Councilman Sylvester thanked the police for their efforts on Netcong Day.

The Fire Department had 10 calls, 11 drills, 5 meetings and 4 special details. Sixty four firefighters volunteered 1328 hours protecting the citizens.

Regarding the Fire on Highland Ave, Councilman Sylvester noted that neighbors went in and pulled people out. They should be recognized in some fashion via certificates etc. at a public meeting

Fire Inspection Co. #2 Oct. 12^{th:} He attended Boonton parade Labor Day and noted that the Fire Department received many awards 1st place men marching 2nd and 3rd place for units

1. COAH Update: Mr. Robert Oostdyk provided an update on the filed Declaratory Judgment –there were no objectors at first hearing. All were noticed and no one came. Netcong is one of the few towns that can use the same plan. He also noted that since COAH doesn't really exist, we should rename this.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR TO THE COUNCIL

President Still had questions about the water main on Center St. He did not understand why the engineer did not find this line. This is costing us lots of

money. It goes back to College Rd and now there is a problem at Betty Hughson's house. He stressed that the Engineer needs to do more investigations before projects and applications

Councilman Hathaway wanted to comment on Netcong Day. The Squad had a lot of calls. Melissa Sylvester broke her leg. NCP had a big draw with free rides and DJ. Can't say enough about what the Police Department does, they handled things very professionally. He thanked Administration: Cindy and Ralph dealt with issues and stayed the day. Councilman Sylvester and the Mayor stayed all day. It was quite an undertaking for such a small group. Regarding the DPW, they handled all odds and ends; they go above and beyond.

Councilman Hathaway also wanted to note that the Lake Board has been engaged in biological treatment took measurements to see what effect is has. It has increased an inch deeper for lake
