Mayor Nametko called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M.

The Mayor opened the meeting to the public. Seeing no one stepping forward, the Mayor asked for a motion to close.

### **CORRESPONDENCE**

1. Letter from Roxbury Township – Housing Plan Element Adoption

Mr. Bucco explained that this is a draft which is part of the COAH process. Netcong will be required to do the same thing.

Councilman Sylvester expressed concern regarding the new complex coming in on Route 46 in Roxbury. Mr. Blakeslee stated there were no changes to that project. Councilman Sylvester interjected that there are changes and he was concerned about the 20% set aside for COAH and that part of Roxbury has no supporting services on that end of town. It is a nationally known truck stop at the top of the hill and this concerns him.

Mr. Bucco explained the Sarlo law which allows the removal of age restrictions and developers can choose this option.

2. Rental Registration on the floor of state assembly.

Mr. Bucco says this is great news to reverse the decision to allow towns to do rental registrations each year. It was presented in the house today and will go to the Senate committee on Dec. 14. If the senate passes it, there will be a voting session on Thursday; then it could proceed to the floor. Mr. Bucco added it will probably pass by January. He feels Netcong should have relief in this situation.

The Mayor requested that when Mr. Bucco gets back to Trenton, he should tell the other assembly members that this will make up for some of the differences in the Verizon losses.

Councilman Sylvester noted that there are email addresses to contact committee members. He added that it is about compliance and safety not just the money.

Mr. Blakeslee noted that they had found things in the inspections missed by state inspectors.

Mr. Bucco summarized that this covers a lot of issues such as fires, stacking etc. and should sail through both houses

#### BOROUGH ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

The Application for Infrastructure Trust Fund Loan has passed the first level. We are asking for 5 million worth of funding- public notice will be in the paper next week.

The bulk of this work was done by Bob Guerin. Mr. Blakeslee will send the electronic copy to all members of the Council; it provides a good description of what will be accomplished.

The new IT vender started. There was an issue this morning and they responded immediately. There will be additional cost in the 2016 budget for this service but it will be well worth it.

He noted that the leaves in drains are a bad situation. The roads need to be swept to avoid this. He did not feel it was difficult to spend a few hours each day during leaf season to clean the roads

Councilman Koster spoke about the Holiday Parade and thanked the Police Department and DPW for their hard work. He noted an increase in people on the streets; much more than Memorial Day.

Councilman Koster asked if the way finding signs have been completed. They will be very helpful to find things in town. Mr. Blakeslee noted that not all signs are completed yet.

The Mayor thanked the Fire Department, Police Department and DPW for their work at the parade. He noted the biggest crowd seen at any parade in town. This is a growing event.
