NEW BUSINESS

1. Energy Aggregation Program Presentation

Wendy Molner and Mark Logrippo provided a presentation regarding the program and how it will benefit the town. They listed some of the towns that have joined. Ms. Molner explained deregulation of electrical providers and the particulars of the program. An ordinance must be passed before the program can be accepted. Residents can opt in and out of the program at will. Bills do not change. They will still be delivered by JCP&L. Any outages or questions are still directed to JCP&L. There will be no door to door sales. This program is offered to save money. Outreach is done by their team not the 3rd party. There will also be an interactive video on our website. Concord, her company, is the state's energy consultants. Ms. Molner noted some of the savings for some of the 40 NJ towns already in the program. Some towns have made co-operatives in order to get better savings with volume.

Mr. Logrippo introduced himself and let everyone know this program is sponsored by the state. Councilman Sylvester asked if everyone in the town is in at the beginning. The reply was "yes." Residents would always have the option to opt out. The bidding by the state is done once per year. The rate will never go above the state's rate. The Mayor asked if the medium size companies can take the load of all these towns. It is stated they are already providing the power. The program contract cannot go longer than 14 months. Ms. Molnar listed the companies involved. There are further questions from the Council members. Wharton would be the Borough's lead agency for the Morris County Co-op. The consulting company gets paid by the third party not Wharton or the cooperative. Councilman Hathaway questioned how the third party says the MSA has been in a co-op or many years and has saved money. The Mayor asked if Concord is a private company. Ms. Molnar replied that it was and is owned by one man and has been around for 20 years. There are about 60 municipalities in NJ doing this now.

Councilman Albensi asks if the Wharton cooperative has better prices because of their size. She said everyone gets the same price regardless of size. It does not change based on people opting out. The Mayor asked if a copy of the contract could be left with the Council. Ms. Molnar will send it to Mr. Blakeslee. The estimate for savings is 8-10%.

The Mayor thanked them for their time.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR TO THE COUNCIL

Council President – The dump truck was determined to be worth \$2500.00 in scrap so that is what Councilman Sylvester offered them. Other towns have been given the opportunity to bid on it. If there are no other bids, the truck will be part of Netcong.

Councilman Still – Regarding Mary Pierson: everyone got the letter and phone call. The Mayor stated he met with Keith and said Allen St. is where Mary grew up and lived. They would like to approach the county about putting Mary Pierson Way above the Allen St. sign. Councilman Laureys asked if we would need permission from the county if we put this name on another road. Councilman Sylvester explained how a new sign can be placed directly above the existing road signs with her name. Mr. Blakeslee can form a letter regarding this.

A Motion to write a letter to the county to name Allen St. Mary Pierson Way was made by Councilman Still and seconded by Councilman Sylvester.
Roll Call: 6 Yes

Chairman Still asked for a sign for Councilwoman Cissy Laureys at the recycling center. All were in agreement.

Councilman Still made a motion to name the Recycling Center after Cissy Laureys and post a large sign. Councilman Hathaway seconded the motion. Roll Call: 6 Yes

Councilman Hathaway - reminded everyone about the Fireman's Challenge on Sat. August 19th from 11 to 4pm. Raffle tickets are available. He noted that the funds will be used to continue improving the lake quality. He discussed the last water chestnut pull and the improvements that have been made due to the chestnut pulls and biologic added to the lake. He also explained the hydro rake is in the lake and being used which should be very effective. It is moored where the harvesters are kept. The small harvester will be removed from the lake to assist another entity with issues in their area.

MAYORS COMMENTS

The Mayor requested to have a second public session at the end of the meeting to accommodate late comers. The Council agreed this should be added to each agenda going forward.
