MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF NETCONG HELD MARCH 12, 2020 AT THE NETCONG MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 23 MAPLE AVENUE, NETCONG, NEW JERSEY COMMENCING AT 7:30 PM.

Mayor Nametko called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

No minutes were presented this evening.

PUBLIC PORTION OF MEETING

Mr. Wayne Anthony, 24 Dell Ave. (He is on the Planning Board but is here as resident.) He would like to know if sidewalks could be required for Planning Board applications going forward. The Mayor responded and gave explanation to the reason why there were no sidewalks required for the current project at Morgan's Funeral Home. The Mayor agreed with Mr. Anthony and gave explanation to the struggle on this subject. Mr. Anthony explained the current project for Morgan's Funeral Home would be 75 feet of sidewalk. Even though at this point there are no sidewalks on either side, sidewalks could be added later. The Mayor gave his reasons for the vote he made at the Planning Board meeting. He suggested they could go back to the other properties to require sidewalks. Councilman Hathaway stated his feelings on this matter. There was further discussion on the current project at Morgan's. Mr. Anthony feels we should have complete sidewalks going forward. Councilman Sylvester asked several questions and made several strong comments about how the Planning Board makes their choices. Mr.

3. Ordinance 2020-4- AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR BLOCK 28, LOTS 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20 & 21 IN THE BOROUGH OF NETCONG

Councilman Hathaway explained that the Planning Board caught a situation in this redevelopment plan and he feels this needs to be changed before this is adopted. Mr. Bucco gave the details on the memo received by the Planning Board about their concerns with this ordinance. Mr. Bucco suggested this ordinance be tabled this evening so these issues can be reconsidered. Councilman Hathaway gave further details on this subject. There was discussion among the Council. Councilman Hathaway suggested the Borough could sell or deed them the property. Mr. Bucco said the mechanism would be for the Borough to vacate a portion of the road, the engineer would do a meets and bounds description and then the property owner could purchase this and merge it with their lot. Councilman Laureys had several questions about the details. Councilman Hathaway said the property owner is amenable to it. There was further discussion on this matter.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR TO THE COUNCIL

President Sylvester: Asked if Indian's field is booked for the entire year. He added "What are the contributions of the organization?" Councilman Hathaway said he sits on the soccer board. He has encouraged the club to use the field. The club has not made an actual commitment but they would like to make some improvements. Byram is offering to make a financial contribution for the improvements. The Mayor requested this contribution be done on a yearly basis. Councilman Hathaway provided several comments regarding this matter.

Councilman Hathaway: Regarding Lake Musconetcong, a grant has been submitted for the care of the lake and the algae bloom. Two private lakes were funded and Lake Musconetcong was not. He provided details and does not understand why we are passed by, multiple times. There were 200-300 research hours and \$16,000.00 spent on the grant and it was ignored by the State. The Mayor gave several comments on this subject. He is requested the Borough and Mr. Bucco send correspondence to the State to oppose this decision. Mr. Bucco has already asked for an explanation to why it was not funded.

Councilman Koster and Councilman Hathaway have discussed expanding the concrete pad at DiRenzo Park as the late Councilman Albensi had always requested. Councilman Hathaway feels this would be advantageous. The Mayor made several suggestions on possibly having donations to pay for it. Councilman Hathaway feels this is the community meeting place.

He also gave a suggestion on possible walking path for the Wiltop Rd area Behind Route 80. The Mayor agreed. He asked that our engineer do some plans for these 2 projects. He requested that the Administrator contact the engineer to get an estimate and concept plan for these projects

Councilman Koster: reported that the Scott Air Pack Grant for the fire department has been submitted after much hard work done by the Mayor and Councilman Sylvester.

He also noted that we have several police officers who will be getting a 200 club award in September.
