For the month of September 2021, the Borough had a total income in the amount of \$248,357.61 as compared to \$132,636.21 in September 2020.

For the month of September 2021:

Miscellaneous Revenue Not Anticipated (MRNA): In 2021 the Borough received \$1,879.00 compared to \$4,641.00 in 2020

Other Licenses/Borough Clerk's Fees: The Borough received \$10,479.11 in 2021 compared to \$7,256.31 in 2020.

State Aid: There was \$117,571.80 in 2021 and nothing in 2020.

Grants in Aid: We did not receive any grants in 2021 and \$6,214.40 in 2020.

Taxes Collected: The Borough collected \$118,427.70 in 2021 compared to \$114,464.50 in 2020.

Income Total Year to Date: The Total Income Year to date for 2021 is \$8,351,150.16 as opposed to \$7,699,803.39 in 2020.
