MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF NETCONG HELD January 9, 2025 AT THE NETCONG MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 23 MAPLE AVENUE, NETCONG, NEW JERSEY COMMENCING AT 7:30 PM.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Still at 7:30 PM.

Those in attendance this evening were Councilman Eddy, Councilman Hathaway, Councilman Laureys, Councilman Morton, Councilman Nametko, Councilman Sylvester and Mayor Still. Also present was Mrs. Eckert, Borough Clerk and Mr. Blakeslee, Borough Administrator.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A Motion was made by Councilman Hathaway and seconded by Councilman Sylvester to approve the above noted minutes.

PUBLIC PORTION OF MEETING

Mr. Wayne Anthony, 24 Dell Ave. and Netcong OEM, stated we had a house fire this week and two families lost their homes. He said the fire department, the police and the DPW did an outstanding job. We are very lucky to have a great team of first responders.

The victims were at the Anthony household, the community came together to provide for the families. There are many residents providing gift cards, Don Jose is providing lunch for them every day. Councilman Hathaway and Lenape Valley have donated chrome books. Donations keep coming in. There have been multiple clothing donations. The Netcong School moms have gone out of their way to help. Newton Tractor Supply came and donated pet supplies. Little girl lost her American Girl doll, and someone donated the money to purchase another one. An XBOX is still needed. He again thanked all responders and DPW for their efforts. Councilman Nametko said the Rotary reached out and Music Den will be donating a flute. The mayor thanked Mr. Anthony for opening his home to the victims. Everything went well considering the circumstances. The mayor also expressed that he was very proud of our police, fire and road departments and other towns who helped to fight the fire. He also thanked Councilman Hathaway and residents.

Mr. Gregory Yakimec, 62 Koclas Dr., is excited to improve this residence and make Netcong his home. He is very pleased with the staff in the borough. Mr. Hess came out to check his water issues. He wants to address the letter he sent to the Council. There is a gas line in the road that he would like to hook up to even though there is a moratorium on the road since it has been recently paved. He is asking that he can open the road to hook up to the gas now since he has to replace the burner. Councilman Hathaway asked if there is a moratorium on the road at this time. Mr. Blakeslee explained there is a 5-year moratorium because DOT does not want a newly paved road to be opened. This has always been a practice in the past. Councilman Nametko said if this was a current resident who wanted to change their heat system, they should not be allowed; but because he is a new homeowner and has no heat at this time, we should consider allowing this. Mr. Blakeslee provided the history of this house and how run down it has been. Councilman Laureys asked if the DOT may not approve of this. Mr. Blakeslee responded. Councilman Nametko is glad to have an oil tank near the lake removed and a gas line put in. Mr. Bucco said a motion can be made when we come to the correspondence portion of the meeting. Mr. Hess, DPW Superintendent said the line is approximately 6 ft. off the curb. There was discussion among the Council on this. Mr. Yakimec thanked the Council for their time.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance & Insurance: J. Nametko J. Sylvester

For the month of December 2024, the Borough had a total income of \$523,314.06 as compared to \$701,565.25 in 2023.

For the month of December 2024:

Miscellaneous Revenue Not Anticipated (MRNA):

In 2024 the Borough received \$2,224.00 compared to \$2,185.75 in 2023.

Other Licenses/Borough Clerk's Fees:

The Borough received \$26,653.08 in 2024 compared to \$57,854.23 in 2023.

State Aid:

There was \$19,834.64 received in 2024 and \$21,827.78 in 2023.

Grants in Aid:

We received \$36,672.58 in 2024 and \$48,392.78 in 2023 for Grants in Aid.

Taxes Collected:

The Borough collected \$72,722.33 in 2024 compared to \$178,054.49 in 2023.

Water and Sewer Utility:

The Borough collected \$357,397.11 in 2024 compared to \$369,250.22 in 2023.

Solid Waste Utility:

There was \$7,810.32 collected this past month.

Total Current Fund Year to Date:

The total Current Fund Income Year to date for 2024 is \$12,590,500.07 as opposed to \$12,791,611.84 in 2023.

Total Water and Sewer Utility to Date:

The total Water and Sewer Utility Income Year to date for 2024 is \$1,716,077.6 as opposed to \$1,740,853.82 collected in 2023.

Total Solid Waste Utility to Date:

The Solid Waste Utility collected Year to date is \$256,393.02.

Total collected from all funds Year to date is \$14,562,970.25 in 2024 compared to \$14,561,155.66 in 2023.

Mr. Blakeslee noted that there should have been a budget meeting with the CFO, Auditor and finance clerk but that has been postponed.

Economic Development: R. Hathaway J. Nametko

Councilman Hathaway reported that the Mt. View final site plan has been filed and approved. They plan to break ground this spring.

The Koch property will close on January 31st and then they should be able to move forward.

Public Safety: J. Sylvester T. Morton
(Police, Fire, Rescue)

Councilman Sylvester thanked the fire department for their great work with the house fire that happened this past week. He also thanked the police and DPW and Wayne Anthony after helping with the fire, put on his OEM hat and compassionately cared for the victims.

Councilman Sylvester stated there are rumors that the fire department was slow in getting to this fire. He wanted to state the dispatch call was 7:22 the fire chief was at the scene at 7:25 and by 7:28 there was water on the fire. Within 10 minutes 3 trucks were at the scene. The Netcong Fire Department has one of the fastest reaction times in the county. Our volunteers are professional. The mayor stated Netcong Fire. Dept. is one of the best in the county.

OLD BUSINESS

Councilman Morton stated that 3 months ago a resident complained about the pickle ball court. He wants to know what progress we have made. Mr. Blakeslee stated we have gates ordered so the courts can be closed. We have looked into sound mats for the fences. He will probably put this in the capital budget. There was discussion about the low sound balls. Councilman Nametko is willing to donate the low sound balls.

NEW BUSINESS

None presented.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR TO THE COUNCIL

The Council President, Councilman Nametko, had a comment. Every year we have the Commissioners reach out to the Council to ask for support for re-election. Every year he asks that they do something about the dispatch service. He feels we need to put pressure on the county to have the contributions for the comm center to be across the board countywide. All towns should pay in. The mayor stated we need to address the library and comm center issues. The mayor asked if they get called, they bring up these two issues. Councilman Nametko stated he sleeps well at night because of our fire depts.

Councilman Hathaway echoed what Jack and Wayne Anthony said tonight. He said in these situations a minute can seem like an hour. He confirmed that the Police Department was on site in 2 minutes. He does not understand how someone could critique that. He was not home at the time of the fire. He was concerned with the strong winds that could spread the fire. It was only because of the quick action of our first responders that this did not happen. This could have been so much worse. The DPW was there to spread salt to keep the fire fighters safe. He does not want to have his name attached to any critique of this fire department. He gave further comment on this issue, and the value of our volunteer firefighters.

Councilman Hathaway also noted that Crown Walk had a call out on Sunday for smoke. He provided details on this issue. He is concerned about this property and the possible cost cutting at this site. He wanted to know how we can follow up on this. He knows the Board of Health was contacted and they did follow up, the trash was cleaned. The property manager stated it was due to the holiday. There was further discussion on this property. Councilman Hathaway wants to make sure we follow up on this issue to make sure the trash is cleaned. He stated this developer is still dragging his feet on the PILOT. He is not happy with this developer. Mr. Blakeslee stated this is a disturbing event and the borough is on top of it. He stated we cannot begin the PILOT until a final CO is issued. He gave further detail on this issue and the details that need to be completed. He understands the frustration. Mr. Bucco was asked if there is something we can do about this. He suggested a timeline be established and if it is not met, a summons should be issued. There was further discussion on this issue. Mr. Blakeslee did have a conversation with Mr. Bryce on this subject. Councilman Hathaway is concerned this owner is not paying what he should and not maintaining the property. There was further discussion on this. Mr. Bucco will look into this matter. Mr. Bucco requested the administrator contact him with these issues.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

The mayor thanked all first responders and he is very proud of the work they do.

Mr. Saaid Mosquera, 12 Dell Ave., is the resident of 12 Dell Ave. He was the one who made the call to 911. He stated the rumors are false. The fire department was there immediately. He said they did a fantastic job. He asked about the county communications work. Councilman Nametko stated after 911 the county was going to put a communication center in place and the whole county would be paying for it. However, some towns have their own and don't pay for it. Councilman Sylvester gave further details on this issue. It was understood there would be no fee for the county. He wanted to know if it is all volunteer work. He asked about the fire hydrants. Councilman Sylvester stated the trucks come with water on them. He gave detail on how this works. It was stated they also drafted from the lake. There was further discussion on how the water is provided. The DPW increased the pumps at the wells so that there would be enough pressure for the hydrants. Mr. Hess, Dept. Super. provided details on how the pressure works. His last point was that he wants to know if he can get a copy of that timeline. He thanked the first responders and Wayne, Bob and Renee.

Ordinance 2025-1

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF OF POLICE TO EXECUTE AN APPLICATION FOR A CHARITABLE SOLICITATION PERMIT FOR NETCONG VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY NO. 1'S "COIN DROP" MAY 23, 2025, RAIN DATE MAY 24TH, 2025, JULY 18TH, 2025 AND AUGUST 15TH, 2025, RAIN DATE AUGUST 16TH, 2025 AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF ALLEN STREET AND LEDGEWOOD AVENUE AND MAIN STREET AND ROUTE 46 AND ROUTE 183 IN THE BOROUGH OF NETCONG, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the members of Netcong Volunteer Fire Company No. 1 wish to hold their annual "Coin Drop" on Memorial Day and Columbus Day weekend at the intersections of Allen Street and Ledgewood Avenue and Main Street and Route 46 and Route 183 in the Borough of Netcong; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:4-60 requires charitable organizations to obtain municipal approval before soliciting contributions within municipal roadway; and

WHEREAS, charitable organizations are also required to obtain a Charitable Solicitation permit from the New Jersey Department of Transportation (hereinafter, "NJDOT"); and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT application must be accompanied by a certified copy of a municipal ordinance approving the solicitation and authorizing the appropriate municipal official to execute the application on behalf of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Chief of Police has reviewed the Fire Company's solicitation plan and has found same to be acceptable and in accordance with the NJDOT's guidelines; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council wishes to approve the Fire Company's request in accordance with the procedures established in N.J.S.A. 39:4-60.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Netcong, in the County of Morris, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Borough of Netcong hereby approves Netcong Volunteer Fire Company No. 1's request to hold a "Coin Drop" on Friday, May 23, 2025, Rain date, Saturday, May 24, 2025, Friday, July 18, 2025 and Friday August 15, 2025, Rain date, Saturday, August 16, 2025 at the intersections of

Allen Street and Ledgewood Avenue and Main Street and Route 46 and Route 183. The dates and times approved for said solicitation are as follows: Friday, May 23, 2025, between the hours of 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.; Rain date, Saturday, May 24, 2025, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; Friday, July 18, 2025, between the hours of 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.; and Friday, August 15, 2025, between the hours of 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.; Rain date Saturday, August 16, 2025 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.;

SECTION 2. The approval authorized herein is subject to and expressly conditioned upon the following:

- a. The Fire Company's compliance with all rules, regulations and guidelines promulgated by the NJDOT for charitable solicitations, including, but not limited to, the posting of any and all necessary warning signs; and
- b. The approval of the Morris County Board of Chosen Freeholders and the NJDOT.

SECTION 3. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized and directed to execute the application for a Charitable Solicitation Permit for Netcong Volunteer Fire Company No. 1's "Coin Drop," provided the above-stated conditions are met. The Netcong Borough Police Department shall be responsible for supervising the solicitation and enforcing the terms of the Charitable Solicitation Permit issued by the NJDOT.


SECTION 4. All ordinances of the Borough of Netcong, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.



3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.


